I built about 30, but am attached to only 5-- and yours is one of the five. If I had known it was on the market I would probably have bought it--and continued to live in California.

Unfortunately, I have forgotten where the beams and the flooring came from. The floors are the most beautiful in any of the houses—the beams were initially stained too dark, but I hope they have faded. If I remember right I think the floors (which are old pine, of course) came from a boys school somewhere in North Carolina—I had a clipping at one time about it—couple of hundred years old. The beams probably came from an old tobacco warehouse in Winston Salem. The brick is also used brick—don't know now where it came from. The wood on the outside and inside walls is cypress—new, from Scotland Neck, North Carolina. I love it.

I went through a grief period of sorts after I moved out hereit is so beautiful, but the houses are junk and the prices out of sight. Your house here would cost at least \$250,000 where I live.

I will probably be in North Carolina sometime before the year is out and would love to come by for coffee, wine or Scotch for an hour and maybe I can come up with something more illuminating.
